VILLAGE RECYCLING PROGRAM

GUIDELINES FOR CURBSIDE GARBAGE SERVICE

CURBSIDE GARBAGE SERVICE

- Pickup once per week.
- Garbage must be placed curbside the night before collection day or prior to 5 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection.
- Trash should not exceed three hundred (300) lbs. in the provided 96 gallon rollout container per residential unit.
- Items NOT accepted for pickup include: hazardous waste.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICE

- Pickup every other week. Placement of containers need to be a minimum of 3 feet apart for the mechanical arm of truck to pick-up. Suggest that recycle on one side of driveway and garbage on opposite side, which will allow ample room. Too close and one of bins will be tipped over by arm.
- Recyclables must be placed curbside the night before, or prior to 5 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection.
- Please use Advanced Disposal provided 96-gallon bin and at a 300 lb. maximum.
- Items accepted for pickup include: Tin and aluminum cans, clear and colored glass container, plastics #1, #2, #3, #5 & #7, loose corrugated cardboard cut a no larger than 24" x 24" and placed in bin, newsprint and magazines no larger than 24" x 24".
- Items **NOT** accepted for pickup include: Styrofoam, Rubber, Batteries, Plastic grocery bags, shipping materials nor hazardous waste. If in doubt throw it out in garbage container.

BULK WASTE SERVICE

Bulk cleanup is offered at a mutually agreed time and location. Such collection shall
consist of placement of a 30-yard container on Village property. Watch for Village
posting on this service.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

There will be no pickup on the following holidays:

New Year's Day

Memorial Day

Independence Day

Labor Day

Thanksgiving Day

Christmas Day

ROUTES CAN BE PUSHED BACK BY ONE DAY FOLLOWING A HOLIDAY, BUT AT DESCRETION OF GARBAGE COLLECTION AGENCY. BEST TO STILL PLACE OUT ON SCHEDULED WEEK DAY.

For example, if Christmas Day is Monday and your normal service day is Tuesday, you might be serviced on Wednesday. But always best to have out early, but note that it depends on the workload of collection agency.
